

Introduction

Fund aims

This fund aims to support:



 People with limited resources. This means people who do not have enough money to buy the things they need and want.



• People in crisis.

A **crisis** is when someone is going through a very difficult situation and needs help quickly.



Groups and organisations supporting vulnerable people.

Vulnerable means people who might need help and support to stay safe and well.

In the past this fund has paid for things like:



 Equipment for activities organised by community groups and charities working with vulnerable people in need.



 Important household items. Like bedding, carpets, washing machines and other things.



• Items to reduce **food and fuel poverty**. Like food parcels, blankets, hot water bottles, thermal clothing, and boiler repairs.

Food and fuel poverty is when you cannot afford to buy food, or heat your home.



• Home repairs and redecoration.



 Lunch clubs and other activities that bring the community together. And help people experiencing food and fuel poverty.

How much can you apply for



People and organisations can apply for up to 1 thousand pounds a year.



Organisations applying for a community project can apply for funding for a number of years. This is called **multiple year funding**.

Who can apply



• Groups and organisations working with people who live in the Hawarden area.



• People living in the Hawarden area.

How to apply



You must fill out an online application form. There are 2 application forms:



One for organisations applying on behalf of a person.



One for organisations or groups applying for a community project. Projects should support groups of people.

Important things to know:



• We cannot pay for anything that has happened before:



- We send you an offer letter.



 You send us a signed copy of the terms and conditions.



 You cannot use this fund to support other groups and charities.



• You must spend all the money within 1 year of getting our offer letter.



• You must show clearly in your application why this money is needed.





You can apply for up to 3 years of funding from this fund. We call it **Multiple Year Funding**.



You can still use this funding for 1-year projects. And for buying small items and things you need that meet the aims of this fund.



If you want funding for 3 years, you will need to fill out the extra section of the application form.



You need to explain how you plan to grow your project over the 3 years.



If you are not awarded 3 year funding, you may still get funding for 1 year.

Core funding



Core funding covers the running costs of your organisation. It can be spent on things like staff wages and bills.



It can be hard to find core funding.

Groups can now apply for funding towards their core costs for up to 3 years. As long as:



You can provide your accounts for the last 12 months.



 The amount you apply for is less than half of your yearly income. For example, if you want to apply for 1 thousand pounds a year, your income must be at least 2 thousand pounds a year.

The Wellbeing of Future Generations Act 2015



This is a law about improving life in Wales for people now, and in the future.

To achieve the aims of this law, we must:



• Think about how our decisions might impact people in the future.



• Work better with people, communities, and other organisations.



 Work together to stop problems like poverty, health inequality and climate change.



Poverty is when someone does not have enough money to live on.



Health inequality means people don't always get equal chances to have good health. For example, maybe because of where they live.



Climate change means the change of the earths temperature and weather conditions. It is caused by things like oil and gas.



We want organisations to work better together.



We want organisations to think about how their work fits in with other work that is going on.
