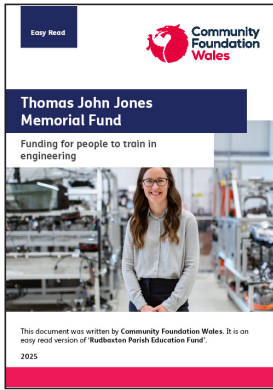

About this fund



This fund is for people who want to train to work in engineering.



Engineering is about designing, testing and building things. For example, engines, machines, and other things.



It can support people from these areas

- South Powys which includes the areas of Penderyn now in RCT.
- Cefn-coed-y-cymmer, Llwyn-onn, Pontsticill, Vaynor and, Trefechan now in Merthyr Tydfil.
- Princetown and Llechryd now in Caerphilly.
- Clydach, Llanelly, and Gilwern now in Monmouthshire.
- Blaenau Gwent.

How much can you apply for?



Individuals studying engineering or a course involving engineering can get up to £3000 a year.



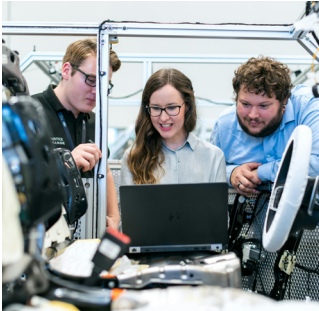
The money must be used for these types of courses:

- Undergraduate level
- Postgraduate level
- Higher National Diploma (HND)
- Doctor of Philosophy (PhD)

Who can apply?



- Students who are living in one of the areas listed on **page 4**. Or people who have gone to school in those areas.



- Students must be studying engineering.

How to apply

Important things to know:



- If you are applying for a Postgraduate level course, you must already have a degree. You must have achieved a first class. Or, upper second class honours.



- You must let us know about any changes that could affect your study. For example, health or change of course.



- We are more likely to give funding to people who show how they meet the goals of the fund.



- The person must show a clear need for the support of the grant.



- Grants will not be given to cover courses that have already taken place.
